MINISTER ARTICLE

The other day I was contemplating our usage of names. We name things as a way of identification which helps with distinguishing and associating objects and events in our lives. Each one of us has a name which we personally identify with, and which also helps us to be distinguishable from others. While deep in thought about names the phrase "A rose by any other name would smell as sweet" from William Shakespeare's Romeo and Juliet popped into my mind. The phrase means that no matter what we call a rose, it will still have the same fragrance. This makes logical sense when thinking about a rose but then I thought about my name and subsequently Namo-Amida-Butsu, Amida Buddha's name. How might this phrase translate symbolically? Perhaps for us it means that our name does not define our true nature or our essence. In our Pure Land practice, we recite Namo-Amida-Butsu as an outward expression of trust in Amida Buddha's compassion. Furthermore, Shinran Shonin taught that what's important isn't the exact words it's the sincerity behind them. Just as a rose's fragrance doesn't depend on its name, Amida Buddha's compassion isn't limited by our use of language or our status.

In life, we often get caught up in labels which can be difficult to move away from. People might judge others based on their name, appearance, status, or even mistakes they've made. But just like the rose, who we are is more than a name. Our kindness, actions, and our heart define us, not what others call us or how we have been distinguished in society. This also means that just as Amida Buddha accepts all beings as they are, we are also worthy just as we are. Whether or not we think we are good enough spiritually or otherwise doesn't change the fact that we are already embraced by infinite compassion. Sometimes, we may doubt ourselves with thoughts that we need to be perfect in life or fit a certain image to be valued. But like the rose, our essence, our kindness, our daily struggles, our aspiration to help others is already meaningful.

Whenever we feel disorientated by the darkness created by labels, judgments, or expectations in life it might help to remember: A rose by any other name is still a rose, and all of us,by any name, are still precious. Our worth doesn't come from names or opinions but from the person we are inside.


The JSBTC Women's Federation takes ALL stamps, foreign and Canadian. Please put any and all stamps in the plastic container in the entrance area by April 20th as they will be taken to the next WF Annual Meeting in Toronto for national consolidation.

These stamps are sold to stamp collectors by the stamp store so the condition of the stamps is important



- Please cut with scissors (do not tear!!) and leave a 1/3 to 1/2 inch border around the stamp.
- Stamps with postmarks showing the location and date are worth more so please cut around the postmark. Leave multiple stamps together.
- If you have a postcard with the postmark showing the date and location, please turn in the whole postcard do not cut it.
- If it does not show the town or city, just trim around the stamp with border as above.
- Stamps without enough border trim and machine generated business postage are not usable.

Sunday, Feb 2, 2025


